Through all the ups and downs of human history, as rulers and nations rise and fall, as ideologies come and go, Christ is our King yesterday, today, and forever. In the words of the Easter Vigil, "All time belongs to Him and all the ages. To Him be glory and power through every age and forever. Amen."
